In community news, and as mentioned previously, on May 11<sup>th</sup> we are pleased to hold a community conversation, in conjunction with our partners at Healthy Lamoille Valley, on preventing youth cannabis use in our communities. This interactive evening will look at where our youth are exposed to cannabis and other drugs and how parents and community members can make a difference. We invite parents and students to be present.

In other news, we have received information about the Centers for Disease Control's (CDC) Health Disparities Grant from the Morrisville office of the Vermont Department of Health (VTDOH) District Director, Aaron French. He reports:

The Vermont Department of Health (VTDOH) along with their local district office (Morrisville) were awarded a significant amount of money to address COVID-19 related health disparities and advance health equity by expanding state health departments capacity and services to prevent and control COVID-19 infection (or transmission) among Black, Indigenous, People of Color (BIPOC) and underserved or marginalized populations at higher risk for COVID-19, including racial and ethnic minority groups and people living in rural underserved communities. The Lamoille District has been awarded \$150,000 to develop and implement projects to bridge these gaps and reduce or eliminate these inequities.

Work at identifying these inequities and gaps in health and human services has just started and we are seeking individuals to participate in the local collaborative, focus groups to assist in sharing those **lived experiences** with this Health Equity Community Collaborative. We fully recognize that attending meetings, whether virtual or in-person, can be challenging for several reasons such as work schedule, lack of Wi-Fi, transportation and fuel costs, etc; therefore, we can offer monetary stipends to assist folks in attending these meetings. It is important to engage community members that can bring that **lived experience** to the table to reduce or eliminate health inequities in the BIPOC and underserved communities. Please join us.
